Show this card to your pharmacist, dentist, and any other healthcare professionals who treat you.

- **Information for patients:**

- Take Apixaban regularly as instructed. If you missed a dose, take it as soon as you remember and continue to follow your dosing schedule.
- Do not stop taking Apixaban without talking to your doctor, as you are at risk of suffering from a stroke or other complications.
- Apixaban helps to thin your blood. However, this may increase your risk of bleeding.
- Signs and symptoms of bleeding include:
 - Bruising or bleeding under the skin.
 - Tar-colored stools.
 - Blood in urine.
 - Nosebleed
 - Dizziness.
 - Tiredness.
 - Paleness.
 - Weakness
 - Sudden severe headache.
 - Coughing up blood or vomiting blood.
- If the bleeding does not stop on its own, seek medical attention immediately.
- Tell your doctor, dentist, or pharmacist that you are taking apixaban before undergoing any surgery or invasive procedure.

- **Information for healthcare professionals:**
- Apixaban is an oral anticoagulant acting by direct selective inhibition of factor Xa.
- Apixaban may increase the risk of bleeding. In case of major bleeding events, it should be stopped immediately.
- Treatment with Apixaban does not require routine monitoring of exposure. A calibrated quantitative anti-Factor Xa assay may be useful in exceptional situations, e.g., overdose and emergency surgery (prothrombin time (PT), international normalized ratio (INR) and activated partial thromboplastin time (aPTT) clotting tests are not recommended) – see Summary of product characteristics (SPC).
- A reversal agent for the anti-factor Xa activity of apixaban is available.
